Jean L. Harris, M.D., Scholarship	"In 1951, Jean L. Harris was admitted into the School of Medicine. She was the first minority student to be admitted into the medical program at the Medical College of Virginia. Since then, Dr. Harris has achieved a most distinguished career in medicine and public service. To recognize Dr. Harris and to support minority students pursuing a medical education, it is proposed that, each year, up to four of the University's twenty freshmen minority scholarship recipients be designated as Jean Harris Scholars. The Harris Scholars will receive full scholarship support, including tuition, fees, and room and board, throughout their four years as undergraduates at the University. Upon completion of their undergraduate work, Harris Scholars will receive guaranteed admission to the School of Medicine, contingent upon their academic performance at the undergraduate level, and they will receive full scholarship support, including tuition, fees, and room and board, throughout their four years of medical education. The Jean L. Harris Scholars Program will be funded in a number of ways. On the undergraduate level, Harris Scholars will be supported from any unawarded funds available in the University Undergraduate Scholarship Program. 	reduced from sixteen to a lower number sufficient to cover the premium costs of the Jean L. Harris Scholars Program. Financial support for Harris Scholars enrolled in the School of Medicine will be provided from private funds or other appropriate sources within the School.
